New Business: Query on Biblical Authority

A noteworthy piece of new business this year is the query about Biblical Authority. It is asking whether we should clarify our stance on scriptural authority. This is concerning as the current paper from 1979 is balanced and represents the diverse view of the Church of the Brethren as a whole. The previous paper identifies eight different understandings of how Brethren interpret the Bible. The paper can be found by going to this web address: www.cobannualconference.org/ac_statements/ and searching for Biblical Inspiration and Authority, it is listed by year.

There is potential for this clarifying to marginalize voices. It opens the possibility to narrow the diversity of the current paper. The Bible can be easily used as a weapon, especially in how it is interpreted or translated. We encourage you to read the current paper and attend business when this query is discussed.

The '79 paper poses this question at the end:
"How can we hold one another in love and fellowship
when there exists a diversity of attitudes among us about
the way in which scripture was given and its interpretation?" While this is a troubling question the paper responds with: "The way is found in the nature of God's creation, through the example and teachings of Jesus,
through the examples of our early Brethren, through acknowledging our human limitations in understanding, and
through being open to the leading of the Spirit who draws
all members of Christ's church together." May we be open
to the Spirit as we hear and discuss this query and the Bible.
